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## **TRAFFIC ALERT**

### **Lane Restrictions on Winton Road Starting December 4, 2017 through Spring 2019**

CINCINNATI – Temporary lane restrictions will occur along Winton Road between Gray Road and north of Dutch Colony Drive beginning Monday, December 4 through spring 2019, weather permitting.

The Metropolitan Sewer District of Greater Cincinnati (MSD) is installing new storm and sanitary sewers along Winton Road as part of a multi-year, multi-phased construction project. This federally mandated project is part of MSD's solution in the Kings Run watershed to reduce combined sewer overflows (CSOs) into the Mill Creek.

The project, known as CSO 217/483 Source Control - Phase C, will remove stormwater from Winton Road and ultimately discharge it into the Kings Run stream and the Mill Creek. There are four additional project phases to be constructed between 2018 and 2019.

About 4,700 feet of new storm sewer and 2,200 feet of new sanitary sewer will be constructed along Winton Road, mainly via open-cut construction. A portion of storm sewer will be installed across Winton Road near 4811 Winton Road using an underground tunneling method.

Traffic will be down to one lane in each direction in the vicinity of the construction work. As the construction moves, the traffic pattern change will move with it. There may be a few times over the course of the construction when traffic will be down to one lane, with a flagger used to move traffic in each direction.

Work is expected to start along Winton Road near Dutch Colony Drive.

MSD's construction contractor is Howell Contractors, Inc. Construction activity is anticipated between 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Work on Fridays or weekends may be needed due to weather or schedule changes.

In addition to traffic inconveniences, typical construction-related disturbances such as noise, dirt and vibrations should be expected throughout the construction period.

This project is part of Project Groundwork, MSD's multi-year plan to reduce sewer overflows into streams and rivers in Hamilton County. Project Groundwork will protect public health, improve our local streams and rivers and enhance our communities.
