TRAFFIC ALERT: Repaving of Sunset Avenue to Start Week of November 14; Traffic Restrictions will be in Effect

CINCINNATI – MSD’s Sunset Avenue project in West Price Hill is winding down, and pavement restoration is expected to start the week of November 14, pending weather and the contractor’s schedule.

Crews are expected to first repave the northbound lanes of Sunset Avenue (going toward Queen City Avenue) and then start on Sunset Lane. The work should be done by early December.

The northbound lanes on Sunset Avenue – between Queen City Avenue and Rapid Run Park – will be closed to traffic during repaving, and the southbound lanes (going toward Glenway) will be converted to two-way traffic (one lane in each direction).

Sunset Lane will be temporarily re-routed as a two-way street; driveway access will not be blocked.

Installation of new storm sewers along Guerley Road is expected to be complete by November 23, and repaving will take place by December 16, pending weather and the contractor’s schedule. Guerley Road will be reopened once the paving is complete.

If the weather does not cooperate, Guerley Road will be reopened to traffic and repaving will occur in Spring 2017.

The Metropolitan Sewer District of Greater Cincinnati (MSD) has installed about 10,000 linear feet of new storm sewers along Sunset Avenue/Rapid Run Pike, Sunset Lane and Guerley Road as part of the ongoing Lick Run Project. *See the attached project location map.*
